ONE SERVICE AT 10:30

Please plan to attend our Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday, February 1 in the Nave after the service. There will be only one service that Sunday at 10:30 and no Adult Education that day. Join us in thanking Jim Braley, Ginger Griffith, and John Kirk for their three years of service on the vestry.

To replace them, we will elect three new vestry members at the Annual Meeting. We have seven (7) candidates this year: Cammie Cox, Steve Franzen, Wayne Glowka, Tammy Kirk, Jeannine Krenson, Martha Power, and Bob Wheeler.

In accordance with a 2008 amendment to the Holy Family By-laws, page 10, some good news on WHO is entitled to vote at the Annual Meeting, “All members who are communicants in good standing, not less than sixteen (16) years of age, as certified by the Rector and present at the meeting shall be entitled to vote on all issues that come before such meeting.” So please note that you do NOT need to be confirmed to vote. All communicants not less than 16 years of age, in good standing and present at the meeting are entitled to vote.

Per Diocese of Atlanta Canons, the qualifications for new vestry members are as follows:

- Confirmed communicant in good standing
- 18 years of age or older
- Regular attendant at the services for at least one year
- Pledged financial support the preceding year

Vestry Members are responsible for:

- The fiscal well-being of the parish property
- Assuring that the facilities are maintained
- Assuring that all bills are paid
- Assuring that each member of the parish is asked to make a financial pledge
- Approving the annual budget
- Seeing that the annual pledge to the diocese is paid
- Obtaining an annual audit of the parish financial statements
- Acting as the sole representative of the congregation in its relationship with the clergy of the parish
- Thinking and acting strategically to accomplish long term goals and objectives
- Attending monthly vestry meetings and retreats as scheduled
- Serving as vestry liaison to at least one ministry/committee
- Periodically performing Vestry Person of the Day (VPOD) duties to include making announcements at both Sunday Services)

Cammie Cox

I started attending Holy Family when my husband Alvin and I moved to Jasper in July 2022. When I was asked to serve on the Nominating Committee, I moved my membership from St. Mark's Episcopal in Louisville, where I was raised, confirmed, and married. At Holy Family, I serve as a lector. In our rector search, one of my roles was to help produce the Parish Profile. Previously, I was a decades-long leader of an adult Sunday School class and served in other leadership roles at St. Matthews United Methodist in Louisville. I believe that when God calls us, we are to serve. I was asked to allow my name to be nominated for the vestry and agreed. If I am chosen, I am committed to our vision and mission as well as the outstanding guidance from our parish wide survey. The Parish Profile is meant to be a living document and I will adhere to the principles expressed by our church family. There was a clear, strong message to continue our long-standing ministry in the community and beyond and to bolster opportunities for education and service on campus. Terry and I raised our family in Gwinnett County where I served as a Juvenile and Family Court Judge before we both retired and moved to Bent Tree in 2017. We are both cradle Episcopalians and both served on the Vestry and as Senior Warden during our 32 years at Christ Church, Norcross.

Wayne Glowka

Beth and I joined Holy Family shortly after Palm Sunday in 2023. With post-graduate degrees from the University of Texas and the University of Delaware, I served as an English professor for 27 years at Georgia College & State University and 13 years at Reinhardt University as an academic dean. In addition to teaching, editing, and writing, I took on a variety of administrative duties involving recruitment of faculty and students, fundraising, budget supervision, personnel management, new program development, and institutional evaluation and accreditation. At other churches in the past, I was involved in music ministry and served terms in a charitable fraternal organization as financial secretary, warden, and council president. In retirement, I have given presentations at Reinhardt University and played music at senior centers and assisted living facilities. GENTLE YOGA: Tuesdays at 11:15 am at the Conference Center with Instructor Dennis Kast


