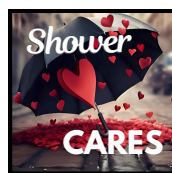

HOLY FAMILY TO FILL LITTLE FREE FOOD PANTRY AT TATE

ELEMENTARY: We have an opportunity to help feed our neighbors in the Tate Elementary area for two weeks this summer. **June 29-July 3**, and again July 20-24. We will work in conjunction with Pickens Collaborative to keep The Little Free Food Pantry filled each day of those two weeks. Please bring your non-perishable/shelf-stable food items and basic essentials to church for the next few Sundays and place them in the container located in the Parish Hall labeled **Little Free Food Pantry at Tate Elementary School**. Members of Outreach and others will keep the "pantry" filled with your donations that week. Some suggested items are listed below, but please feel free to expand on this list as you see fit. If you would like to help with the task of filling the "pantry" during the week, please contact Leamarie True or an member of Outreach.

- dried pasta, beans, and rice
- canned vegetables and fruits
- canned tuna, chicken, and meats
- canned ready to heat/eat soups
- peanut butter
- jelly
- nuts and seeds
- popcorn
- shelf stable milk and formula
- oatmeal, cereal, and breakfast bars
- cereal
- crackers and graham crackers
- kid-friendly snacks: Little Debbie's, Goldfish, raisins, applesauce, freeze-dried fruits, etc.
- basic toiletry essentials

EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY

Education for Ministry (EfM) is sponsored by The School of Theology at the University of the South. At Holy Family, we can accommodate up to 9 new participants for the coming year 2026-27. Sessions begin in early September and run for 36 weeks. The group consists of 6 to 12 participants, plus the mentors. Usually, we meet weekly face-to-face for about 2.5 hours. Zoom is used when someone is not able to be present or when there is a threat of inclement weather.

Every baptized person is called to ministry. EfM provides people with the education “to be” Christians and to carry out their ministries. EfM is a worldwide program developed by the School of Theology at Sewanee. It holds before us that the foundation of bringing Christ to the world lies in a church empowered by an active, theologically articulate laity. Thousands of persons have completed the program. Participants enroll one year at a time, can transfer almost anywhere in the U.S.A. and in many foreign countries, and can obtain 18 Continuing Education Units per year.

You don't have to be Episcopalian, or even Christian, to participate. If you are interested, just ask any of the current or former participants or Byron Tindall or Jeannine Krenson, the mentors. You can also check the Sewanee website. The cost is \$370 per year, and there is some scholarship help available. Each participant furnishes her or his own text books.
