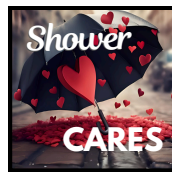
### HEALING

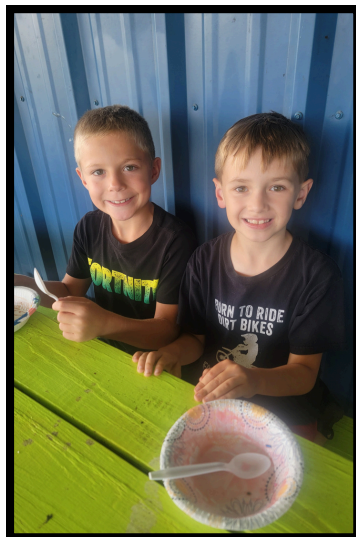
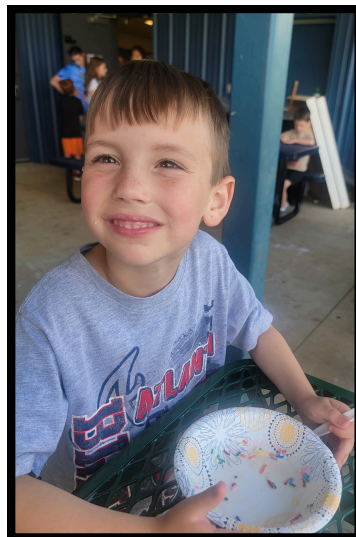
